

ture; but he really gets ahead of himself with the idea of aerial bombs.

An interesting aside to the crux of this tale is that the agents are going to great lengths to protect Admiral Farragut from being torpedoed. Known for his statement, "Damn the torpedoes, full speed ahead," the real Admiral Farragut died in 1870, several years prior to our agents' adventures, and barely one year into the administration of President Ulysses S. Grant.

Other futuristic devices used include: The force field that could incinerate anyone crossing its beam; the underwater spyglass, now more commonly known as a periscope; the homing device in the compact; and Gordon's magnetized coin that explodes at 100 degrees Fahrenheit. "Watery Death" is an entertaining episode with lots of action and more than its share of futuristic inventions.

## The Night of the Green Terror

West and Gordon notice the unusual absence of plant and animal life as they ride through a forest. They encounter a giant knight who hurls a huge boulder in their direction. Suddenly, they are accosted by a band of merry men who encircle the agents and take them prisoner. They are lead to a tent where the lovely Antoinette (Dorin) serenades them. A minute Robin Hood, AKA Dr. Loveless (Dunn), greets them. West instructs Artie to feign no interest in order to compel Loveless to reveal his plan. As expected Loveless tells the agents that the Indian village of Bright Star has been suffering a terrible famine caused by the *Lord of the Forest*. Loveless is the assigned go-between for the Indians and the so-called *Lord* and wants to become known as a great benefactor to the hungry Indians, thereby gaining their loyalty.

The agents start a scuffle and quickly escape on their horses as Loveless emits his signature demonic laugh. The diminutive doctor wanted the escape to occur knowing that the agents will be killed when they reach Bright Star (Caruso).

West and Gordon arrive at Bright Star's village and receive a hostile welcome. West is about to tell the Indians how he can help when Loveless arrives and tells them that the *Lord of the Forest* is angry with them for harboring his enemies, West and Gordon. Artie escapes
